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

Administrators' Message Dear Parents;

The staff at Caswell know that our students are talented in so many areas. However, once in a while we are taken aback at exactly how talented our students are and how willing they are to share the talents they have. Here are a few examples:

- Carter, Emma and Skylar presented on our ArtsSmart project with SUM Theatre
 at the Board Meeting for Saskatoon Public Schools. They spoke eloquently
 about their involvement in the project and the benefits it brought to the students
 of our school.
- Grade 7 and 8 students presented their ArtsSmart sharing in May. This project, featuring stories from the Open Door Society and family members and facilitated by six professional artists from Saskatoon, far surpassed our expectations. The students also wrote very insightful reflections on the experience as evidence of their growth.
- Students from Grades 5 8 shared their growth in band with us during our spring concert. The final number, Theme from Star Wars conducted by "Luke Skywalker" McKenzie, had more than half the school playing in the band!
- Athletes from Grade 5 8 performed well at our school meet. It is great to see our students pour their hearts and souls into track. Those who placed well will be competing at Griffith Stadium on June 10.
- Ruby, Vanessa, Katherine and Emma were finalists in the Caring for our Watersheds competition. They won a cash prize for their team and for our school. The prize money will go towards a rainwater collection system for our school garden.
- Alex, Chayton, Noah and Sam were the second fastest team at the Cardboard Boat Racing Competition. All the teams from our school were commended on their cooperation and their work ethic.
- Grade 7's SAGE students entered the Digging Deeper Challenge, a video contest through the Sask Mining Association. Brayden, Liam, and Ben won first place and \$250; Parker, Kyle and Abdullah won third and \$100; and Faith, Zahin, and Becky received an honorable mention and \$50. The entire class was awarded \$250 for outstanding class effort.
- With the support of our Care and Share partners, we are able to have our students go on bike trips during June. Several groups of students have been on bike trips to River Landing and other places. As always, our students display incredibly responsible behavior on these trips.

All these successes speak to the commitment of the staff at Caswell. Thanks to every staff member who works to provide opportunities for all our students from competitions to gallery visits to bike trips. We strongly believe in providing exciting experiences for all our students so that they may become engaged and active citizens of our community.



Our progress reports are changing in Saskatoon Public Schools



Across our 46 elementary schools the manner in which we report student achievement on progress reports is changing. All students from Kindergarten to Grade 8 will see on their progress report a grade expressed on a 4-point scale.

This includes the following ratings:

N suggests a student is "not yet meeting" grade level outcomes B suggests a student is "beginning to meet" grade level outcomes M suggests a student is "meeting" grade level outcomes E suggests a student is "excelling" relative to grade level outcomes.

The move reflects a province-wide change in curricula. The 4-point scale gauges student achievement relative to a "standard" stated within each subject-level curriculum. Daily assessments, including exams, reports, projects, etc., may still receive a numerical grade. Progress reports, however, will summarize achievement with a single grade for each subject.

Beginning in 2016-2017, parents/caregivers will have the opportunity to view their son or daughter's marks via web-based software. Stay tuned!


What: The grade 7's have been learning about what it takes to be an entrepreneur. They have developed businesses and look forward to serving you, the customers. There

From the Board Table

Highlights from the May 19, 2015, meeting of the Board of Education:

- Board members heard about a successful first year for the iGen Grade 6 intergenerational classroom based at Sherbrooke Community Centre. Teacher Keri Albert was joined by two students and their parents who spoke about how the positive experience of being part of the Sherbrooke community and the unique classroom setting has changed the way they look at other people and their education.
- North Park Wilson principal Sharon Champ, Bedford Road Collegiate vice principal Dwight Kirkpatrick and superintendent Dean Newton shared their experience as part of the division's efforts to provided culturally responsive school leadership and learning opportunities.
- Trustees approved a tender for just over \$247,000 for roofing replacement work at Vincent Massey Community School. Roofing replacement is one of the top priorities for the division's facilities department.
- Funding of \$362,500 was approved for renovations to accommodate student enrolment increase at École Victoria School. Projects include boiler replacement, window replacement and program and functional upgrades.
