Attendance - How to Report an Absence

There are three different ways to clear your students attendance. **Edsby** is our preferred method as it provides you with the most options and is very quick to process on our end, **School Messenger**, or by **calling our office** at 306-683-7755

The following information is required from you when clearing an absence with any of the methods.

Your **students name** (clearly), **who is reporting** the absence (mom/dad/caregiver), what **day/dates/time** your student will be away and the **reason that they are absent**.

*You MUST provide a comment if you are choosing "excused by parent" or the absence cannot be cleared. Please use the comment section for a brief description of the absence (see examples below). In the event that information is missing we will not be able to clear the absence.

If your student:

Is sick - use "ILLNESS" for the reason and if necessary, leave a comment "headache", "flu", "in hospital", etc.

Is emotionally unwell for school - use "EXCUSED BY PARENT" and comment "unwell"

Has an injury - use "EXCUSED BY PARENT" and comment "sprained ankle", "concussion", etc.

Bus was cancelled - use "BUS" and comment "bus cancelled", etc.

Is away for a tournament or competition - use "EXCUSED BY PARENT" and comment "dance comp", "hockey tourney", etc.

Has a doctor or dental appt - use "MEDICAL APPT" and comment "doctor", "dentist", "orthodontist", etc.

Is on vacation - use "EXCUSED BY PARENT" and comment "vacation", "out of town", etc.

Can't get to school due to weather/car not starting/snowed in - use "WEATHER" and comment "car didn't start", etc.

Has had a family member or friend pass away - use "COMPASSIONATE" and a short note, or contact the school directly.

If you are still unsure - use "EXCUSED BY PARENT" and enter a comment with a short explanation and we will get it cleared.

HOW TO CLEAR AN ABSENCE USING EDSBY

- Log in to your Edsby account or Phone App.
- If your student will be away for the full day select "Absent Today".
- If your student will be away part of the day, or a date in the future, select "Scheduled Absence" (please watch the dates/times before submitting). Enter the dates/times.
- Select a reason for the absence and enter a comment (we don't need all the specifics)
- Submit

HOW TO CLEAR AN ABSENCE USING SCHOOL MESSENGER

- Log in to your Messenger App
- If the absence is for part of a day or an upcoming day select "schedule absence", select the student and then "report an absence"
- Select the type of absence, the reason and then choose the date(s).
- Place a note in the comment with an explanation, submit.

Important Information

Appropriate School Clothing

Common sense, good taste, and class should dictate what is appropriate dress for school. Please refrain from wearing clothing, that is offensive, demeaning, or support illegal activities. More detailed information is available in the School Handbook.

Smile - you're on camera!

Marion M. Graham Collegiate utilizes several surveillance cameras, that have been placed both inside and outside the school. Camera areas include the parking lot, front entry, commons area, and other locales inside and outside the school. Student safety and security remain a priority at MMGC.

Calculators for Math Class

Students taking Grade 10 to 12 math courses should have a scientific calculator. Grade 9 students need a calculator with the 4 arithmetic functions and a square root key. A scientific calculator is also acceptable. The school supplies TI83 graphing calculators when they are necessary.

Driver Education

Due to the large number of students requesting Driver Education, and the limited space available, classes will be filled according to the student's date of birth. Students who are registered into a class will receive a letter indicating their start date. All other students will be placed on a waiting list. Please contact our Student Services office at 306-683-7756 for more information.

Parking for Cars and Bicycles

The right to park on school property is a privilege. Student parking is permitted on school property ONLY in the designated areas. Signs indicate where parking is prohibited. The City of Saskatoon Commissionaires will issue tickets to cars illegally parked. Neither the school nor Saskatoon Public Schools have any insurance for vehicles or bicycles parked on school property. Persons parking on school property do so at their own risk. The school can assume no responsibility for the theft of bicycles or bicycle parts. Thefts should be reported to the police and school authorities. Although the area is supervised, we cannot provide continuous supervision of the area to prevent vandalism.

JAPAN EXCHANGE 2025

In the 2024-2025 school year the Saskatoon Public School Division is offering a two-week Japanexchange program during the Easter break. This year the exchange group with 16 students from Saskatoon Public Schools will be visiting our partner school in Takaoka. The students will also have a cultural tour around the Tokyo and Kyoto areas.

For one week of the exchange, they will live with Japanese host families - not as tourists, but as members of the Japanese families - which gives our students the opportunity to enrich their understanding and appreciation of Japanese culture and traditions. They can also practice and improve their fluency in the Japanese language. It is considered an asset but is **not a requirement to be either taking or have taken Japanese to be accepted for the exchange**. However, participants accepted for the exchange will be offered a special weekend Japanese course before they leave.

The estimated cost for the exchange is \$5,500-5,800. This includes flights, transportation, hotels, cancellation and out-of-country medical and accident insurance, and costs for chaperones. Not included in this fee are substitute costs for teacher chaperones and personal expenses, such as, spending money, passports, etc.

Information sheets and an application form will be posted on each school's website in September.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In August, Saskatchewan's Ministry of Education directed all Saskatchewan school divisions to develop procedures that prohibit the use of personal electronic devices during instructional time in K-12 classrooms. Accordingly, Saskatoon Public Schools has updated its related procedure: <u>AP 139 – Use of Personal Electronic Devices</u>.

Summary of the updated administrative procedure:

- Personal electronic devices shall be out of sight and on silent mode during instruction time. Smart watches may be visible but not accessed during instructional time.
- Exemptions may be approved by the principal for students who require a personal device for a specific medical condition, or documented accommodation related to additional needs.
- In grades 9-12, teachers who wish to use personal electronic devices for a specific instructional purpose with students must request an exemption and gain approval from the principal.
- Principals maintain the right to make decisions about the use of personal electronic devices during non-instructional time (e.g. lunch and recess).
- All school staff will continue to model appropriate use of their personal devices to support student safety, classroom learning, assessment and communication with families.

Ways to support this change in procedure:

- Familiarize yourself with AP 139 Use of Personal Electronic Devices.
- Discuss responsible personal device usage and digital citizenship at home.
- Contact the school if you need to reach your child during instructional time.

High School/Collegiate Nursing Services & Healthy Mother Healthy Baby (HMHB) Program

High School/Collegiate nursing services throughout Saskatoon are provided by the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) through the Healthy Mother Healthy Baby Program.

Registered Nursing Services include:

Pregnant Students: The Healthy Mother Healthy Baby program can be accessed by any pregnant student enrolled in Saskatoon High School/ Collegiate or Affiliate School Setting.

General Student Population: Individual healthrelated support & counselling, and/or referrals.

School Staff and Administration: Support to school staff with navigating community health resources. Nurses are available to attend a "School Nurse" meet and greet (please connect with your School Nurse for arrangements).

Supports offered by School Nurse:

- Individual Health Education
- 1:1 supports and crisis intervention (harm reduction strategies, abuse resources, connections for mental health and/or addictions, etc.)
- Support to students, parents and staff with navigating health resources in the community
- As clinically indicated:
 - General first aid
 - Pregnancy testing and referrals

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- Healthy Mother Healthy Baby supports for pregnant students
- Testing for some sexually transmitted infections

Are you taking the city bus to school??



A valid Saskatoon High School student card is required when using a High School bus pass or paying the High School fare rate. Please show your student card along with your pass when boarding.

Transit passes are sold in the school office as well as various locations throughout the city. Please visit Saskatoontransit.ca for specific locations.

There is a \$5 fee for all new cards. GoPass cards can be registered for free at the Customer Service office (226 23rd Street East). Card(s) must be presented at the time of registration.

Lost/Stolen Cards

If a card is lost/stolen, a replacement card can be issued. Please provide one piece of identification to match the name the card is registered to. There will be a \$5 new card activation fee. Over the phone reports of lost/stolen cards will not be accepted as identification is required.

All school special routes are subject to change during the school year.
